Message from Pastor Valerie

THE GOD of "NEW THINGS"
In this Sunday's texts, we have the picture of the new heaven and the new earth at the end of earth's history, and God says, "Behold, I make all things new."

This is the same God who keeps doing "new things" throughout the history that we see in the Bible. Creation was a "new thing". Human beings that were to be God's companions, sons and daughters, was a "new thing". And when those humans sinned, and the world became corrupted beyond repair, God arranged another "new thing"we don't know exactly what it was that brought cataclysm to earth in a great flood, that changed our atmosphere and our climate, and gave us a fresh start. Out of all the nations/peoples that developed. God did another "new thing" when he chose one man, Abram, and his wife Sarai, to create a people for himself. God brought them through phases of growth and development in time, saving them through miraculous events out of slavery in Egypt, and bringing them into the land that God intended for them to have, right at the center of the continents of the Old World. From there, they were to shine the light of the knowledge of God and God's way out to all the world. But sadly, they failed to be faithful, and eventually, God had to take them into exile to reform and make them newly God's own people again.

At that time God said, "Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert..." He speaks (in Isa, 43 and following) of a new Exodus, a rescue to bring them out of exile and back to their land to continue with God's purposes. "I will pour out my Spirit upon your descendants, and my blessing on your offspring..." And a little further on, "O Israel, you will not be forgotten by me. I have swept away your transgressions like a cloud, and your sins like a mist; return to me, for I have redeemed you." Then he speaks of an amazing new happening. God will use a Gentile king to fulfil his plans for Israel, as God "says of Cyrus (a Persian/Iranian emperor) 'He is my shepherd and he shall fulfil all my purpose; saying of Jerusalem, 'She shall be built', and of the temple, 'Your foundation shall be laid." God says he will go before Cyrus to level mountains, break down bronze doors, and bring forth things that are hidden in the darkness, working through him so that the world will know that Israel's God is the one true God. like no other, who can even bend the will of kings to fulfil God's plans. Yes, God has plans and purposes, and God is forever working in history, bringing forth



what needs to be done to fulfil those plans.

In the last few weeks, we have reflected on texts from John and Acts that have spoken of the "new things" that God did in Jesus and the early Church era: resurrection was a great surprise! Then came the new experience of being filled with the Holy Spirit, the tongues of fire, and the gift of tongues. Definitely "new things!" Later, they were amazed and confounded when God made it clear that these gifts from heaven were not only for the Jews, but for all people! And so they got to work taking the Good News of this salvation to all peoples, like us!

God keeps doing new things! And right now we are standing on tiptoes as we wait to see just what God is going to do with us to create a "new thing" for us here at Fristad and with our neighbors. God has plans and purposes, and will do "new things" to get us there, so let's be ready to follow into the blessings the God has already prepared for us. LEAD ON, LORD! Amen.



SERVICE PROJECT — BABY CARE KITS

HIGHLIGHTS FROM COUNCIL MEETING April 28

Minutes approved. Treasurer had good news – all bills paid.

Council decided to send \$150 for the synod assembly offering. GOD BLESS MALAWI PARTNERS!

Pastor is relieved to have the busy Lent season finished, along with extra meetings for CPR.

Pastor raised the possibility of having joint worship with MT and NV on Pentecost, June 9, as in our process we are encouraged to do more together. She will be on vacation that week, but Maggie and Angie could lead a service as they might in the future. Pastor Arndt was scheduled to come, but could perhaps fill the need at Frederic that weekend, if we can arrange something joint. Pastor agreed to talk to Maggie and Angie about that Sunday and see what might work. LOOK FOR "LET'S GO VISIT" INFO.

Property issues: Gary reported that it was recommended that we have a foam extinguisher for the kitchen. Don has 2 bids coming for the driveway sealcoating need. Sign-up sheet will get going for the lawn-mowing need. As the parsonage will be vacated by the end of May, Brent Priebe volunteered to act as liaison with Raus, and Jim Sorensen will be backup. THANKS TO ALL OF YOU WHO LOOK AFTER VARIOUS PROPERTY NEEDS!

Twyla reported that for becoming a SAM (Synod-Authorized Minister for a particular site), Greg Kaufmann indicated that she should participate in the **Lay School 2-year program**, plus

the extra bit that is added each month for SAM's-in-training. This is a program that we should encourage other lay people to take part in, too, to develop more lay people for leadership. ARE YOU CALLED TO STUDY AND GET EQUIPPED FOR DOING SOME MINISTRY? Lay School meets one Friday evening-Saturday day per month, during the school year. See nwswi.org website.

Pastor would like to purchase a couple communion sets for visitation, as we need to get some lay people involved in bringing communion regularly to our shut-ins. WE NEED LAY VISITORS!

Pastor asked about the sound system, the current buzz in it, and the future need for new mics on a new frequency. She will call Audio Architects for advice/service as needed. THINGS ARE CHANGING WITH RADIO/WIRELESS FREQUENCIES – UPDATE IS COMING!

Next meeting was set for May 19.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM CONGREGATIONAL MEETING, MAY 5

For our devotions, we practiced a "Dwelling in the Word" exercise, as we have been doing in our team meetings for our process using the Gospel for the Day, John 21, in which Jesus appears to the disciples in Galilee, where they have "gone fishing", as they used to do. It's like a renewal of their call to become "fishers of people", and Jesus asks Peter to "tend and feed" his "sheep and lambs". WE ARE CALLED TO FISH, AND TO TEND AND FEED!

Minutes were accepted. Treasurer was not available to bring a report, but Shirley shared from our council meeting that all bills were up to date. THANKS FOR YOUR FAITHFUL GIVING!

Pastor Valerie indicated that the new Financial Committee had met to do the work needed for the CPR Taskforce financial considerations. Further meetings might wait, depending on what is decided about congregations coming together, and what that will mean for our own systems.

Since there was no other business, we used the time to hear reports from all the CPR taskforce sub-committees and dream teams about what was being discussed. There was also time for Q & A. We heard about constitutions being similar, but by-laws fairly different. We heard about each congregation's situation financially, and what it might look like if we come together - good! There are also questions of our Foundation and North Valley's Benevolence Association to be handled. We heard that North Valley people want to continue to use their building, and that Milltown people have had to face the reality that their building will not serve them in the future. That becomes a liability issue in our considerations. LET US PRAY FOR GOD'S SOLUTION FOR THAT BUILDING! We heard about various scenarios that could develop - most likely is a consolidation of all three congregations into one new one with two sites; or a joining of 2 with the third as a separate congregation in a two-point parish. An important question was about worship. Although the worship team has only been "dreaming" and not deciding, it seems likely that main worship would be at

CPR Taskforce Update May 18, 2019

This is an update on what our teams have been up to. The **taskforce** has met several times and have meetings set through June. The **Dream Teams** are meeting and will continue to meet to work together and have their recommendations to the CPR Taskforce by June 19. We have met with **Pastor Erin our Synod Mission Development Liaison** and she provided us an outline which is included here.

CPR TEAM SCHEDULE

Subject to change. This schedule is just meant to help with any confusion or uneasiness during this process. Each process is different and we will adjust as Needed!

DREAMING UNTIL END OF JUNE

During the Dream Team process, the Dream Teams and the CPR Taskforce are meant to be Dreaming (or brainstorming) of what ministry could look like and what ministry is possible if the three congregations consolidate. This is not a time to come up with any concrete plans or worry too much about the nuts and bolts. Groups do not have to come up with a plan. They must come up with many ideas of what kind of ministry could happen if we did ministry together. What can we accomplish together? What could ministry look like?

The Dream Teams and CPR Teams are gathering and doing work to answer the questions:

- 1. What is God calling our ministry to look like in the future?
- 2. What possibilities or dreams do we have for what our shared ministry could look like?3. What needs are there in the community that we could respond to with shared ministry?
- 4. Would our ministry be stronger together than apart?
- 5. Would we recommend that the

three congregations continue to make a plan to consolidate into one new congregation?

During this time you will also be mindful of the grief, loss and pain that this process causes. We are hopeful that if God is calling us into consolidation there will be great joy and great gains. But we know that in the midst of this process all three congregations are considering giving up things that they care about very much. Please be mindful of the following:

- 1. We are all not in the same place dealing with the loss, grief and pain. Some of us are in the midst of dealing with these things and others have worked through these emotions already. Let us try not to judge each other and be empathetic and caring.

 2. We are ALL giving up something
- 2. We are ALL giving up something that matters greatly.
- 3. How can you lessen another congregation's grief?
- 4. How can we strive to be flexible and adaptive and open to compromise?
- 5. What is the purpose? To serve Jesus Christ is the best way going forward... this may mean we have to give something up for the sake of the ministry. Be realistic and honor the past, while acknowledging what we need going forward.

REPORTING ON JUNE 30 – 10AM JOINT WORSHIP, PRESENTATION, & POTLUCK AT FRISTAD

The Dream Teams and the CPR Taskforce each make a **3-5 minute presentation**, based on the questions they have been working on.

VOTE IN EARLY JULY

The three congregation councils/or congregations must each have a separate vote, based on the work of the CPR Taskforce and the Dream Teams to authorize their congregation

to continue to plan for and explore consolidation.

PLANNING FOR MINISTRY

Congregations that vote to continue on will begin to make concrete plans for what a new congregation will look like. This work will be carried out and led by the CPR Taskforce with help and assistance from the congregational councils. The Taskforce will take the time needed to be prepared. Tasks will include:

- 1. Writing a constitution (The Synod will assist with this.) Constitution covers membership, council/governance/financial practices.
- 2. Coming up with a name and a mission statement (A synod staff person will lead your congregations through a workshop during which you will come up with a name and a mission statement. Anyone who is a member of any of the congregations can come and help.)
- 3. Working to dissolve and resolve any foundations, endowments and associations that may be part of your existing congregations. (We have a Synod Lawyer who will help with this process.)
- 4. Coming up with concrete plans using the dream team's work. You will also have a synod staff person who can help negotiate these issues:
- a. Staffing
- b. Service times
- c. Building usages
- d. Programming for all areas of ministry.
- 5. Plans for presentation and voting (The Synod will help you plan and provide an election team that is not related to any of the churches)
- 6. Plans for transition if the vote goes through.
- 7. Worshiping together and sharing ministry as the exploration continues.

VOTE AND TRANSITION

- 1. When the CPR Taskforce and Council are done working on the plans for a new ministry, the three church councils will vote to present the plan to their congregations.
- 2. Congregations will be presented the new ministry plan and be given two weeks to review, pray and reflect.
- 3. On the same day, at the same time, three simultaneous votes will take place to form the new ministry. Election officials will count ballots and communicate with each other. If the vote goes through in all three places, each congregation will then vote to

With an easing of finances, other staff such as parish nurse or youth worker could be added. CPR members are grateful that the synod

is willing to provide people to help us with constitutions, with financial accounts, with pastoral call, with transfer of assets, etc – all the legal and financial matters involved. WE ARE NOT ALONE! We have also benefitted from what Spirit Lutheran learned as they went through such a process of two large congregations becoming one new congregation. GOD IS WITH US! HIGHLIGHTS FROM COUNCIL MEETING, May 19

Besides updates on many items from April, the council decided to plan for a new shed for housing our lawnmower and snowblower which have been at the parsonage site. The need for work at the base of the bell tower was noted. Enquiries will be made.

We realized our council/committee list needed to be updated, the audit committee particularly. Shirley will call the 2018 audit members and ask them to serve this year.

Council accepted WELCA recommendation that Rummage sale funds go 5% to Malawi feeding stations, 5% to our Scholarship Fund loan, and 90% to general fund.
